





ECONOMICS:

The Department of Economics at the M.G.M College is a well knit community of committed teaching faculty and a very vibrant group of students. The Economics undergraduate programme provides a strong foundation in Economic theory and Economic analysis. The department makes a constant effort to shape the discipline in a way that is both systematically thorough and socially relevant. Besides class room activities, the department nurtures the teaching learning process by organizing presentations which motivates the students to grow both at academic and personal level.

The department currently has two faculties Dr. Kavika K. Yepthomi and Ms. Enanylou. Since the college is yet to offer Honours in Economics, the students taking Economics as one of their optional paper is eight-five boys and three girls.

Literature play a determining factor in building the personality of a person. It is a vital channel of expression and communication. It is therefore imperative to the faculties of this department to equip all the students to possess effective interpersonal skills. With this aim in view, a variety of activity based methodologies have been applied in cognizance of its significance like group discussions, debates and mini debates to spark free conversation and to groom the students. Projects, presentations on chosen topics, assignments and class-room interactions were also held inside the class with the aim to give the students adequate language practice.

Different reading intervention programmes are also implemented to enhance reading and comprehension. Reading-aloud, silent reading, repeated readings were the strategies followed to strengthen those skills. Pre-Test and Post Test along with intensive review classes were also conducted to test comprehension.

The English Department have also organised literary events from 24th to 27th of October 2017 with the aim of enhancing the talents and hidden potential in each individual outside the four walls of their classroom. Many activities were conducted which candidly reflected on their talents and activity like solo, group songs and dance competitions. To foster love for literature, debates and story writing competitions were also held.

For the upcoming semester other activities will also be introduced to enhance learning like role play, skits and exchange classes for the students aside from the usual assignments, presentations, class tests and debates.



THE STATUS OF ECONOMICS AS A SCIENCE: THE PRESENT SCENARIO

Economics as a science has not had a development during the past fifty years which is commensurate with the attention which has been given to it, as this interest expresses itself in the large number of educational institutions which give it a place in the curriculum, the large number of courses offered, and the remarkable increase in the number of students who pursue it as a subject of study in both the undergraduate and the graduate departments of these educational institutions. Nor do economists exercise an influence on public thinking and economic policies of the nation, as expressed in legislation and business conduct, which is proportionate to the numbers who are supposed to be trained in correct economic thinking.

Possible explanations for this condition may be: firstly, there has been a bizarre devotion to the so-called classical doctrines of Smith, Ricardo, Mill, Malthus, and other "founders" of the science. We seem to be willing to accept their analyses and be content with their conclusions, in spite of the fact that we all agree that economics is the science of wealth production and consumption, or the science of business. We further agree that the present industrial organization, its institutions and agencies and forms of wealth, differ to a great extent from those existing at the time the 'founders' wrote. In the second place, the advance of the science has been retarded by the influence of the historical school of economists. There is no disposition on the part of any well-informed economist to deny the service rendered to the science by the work of the historical school. But the doctrines of this school have frequently been accepted too seriously and their methods followed too closely. This has expressed itself both in graduate and in undergraduate work, but especially in the former, as a long-continued and most detailed investigation into the past economic history for facts which would explain the economic institutions of the present. It is a common error to assume that everything in the present has had its precursors in the past.

The most pressing single need of economics as a science is a careful inductive study and combination of present economic phenomena marshaling of the inherently correlated facts of particular phases of the subject, and the rational, necessary deductions which follow. Indeed, there is at hand a surplus of economic facts. We already have more facts than we can interpret. An introspective analysis and interpretation of these facts is needed. As teachers we are continually emphasizing to the student the importance of developing his analytical faculties, but strangely enough the student is rarely encouraged to learn how to generalize properly. Analysis must, of course, go before practical generalization, but economics, of all sciences, needs proper generalization. Economics, as it is pursued by many of its students, is too often like a ship without a home port, or a railway without a terminus.
